Checklist for application for Norwegian National Identity Number

All documentation requirements **must** be finalised before the appointment. Your application will **not** be processed if the document requirements are **not** met. Please go to our <u>website</u> for more information.

Documentation requirements:

- Go to Skatteetaten's webpage first and go through the checklist: <u>Norwegian national identity number to</u> get a passport - The Norwegian Tax Administration (skatteetaten.no)
- Original and valid passport (must include photo, date of birth and signature) of the parent(s) attending the appointment.
 - o If the passport is not Norwegian, a certified true copy must also be brought to the appointment.
 - Ensure that the passport is signed under "Passport holder's signature".
 - If the passport is with the visa section in connection with an application, you must collect it before the appointment with the consular section.

□ Consent given by both parents:

- If both parents are listed on the birth certificate, the embassy will need consent from both parents for the application.
- o If one parent cannot attend the appointment, please see here: Samtykke

□ Original birth certificate

- \circ The birth certificate must be legalised by the competent authority before the appointment.
- Original documents must be submitted to the embassy to carry out the necessary inspections. They will be returned once the application is completed.
- If you do not wish for original documents to be sent to Skatteetaten then you must bring certified true copies of the documents.
- If the child is a dual citizen, their other passport should be brought to the appointment.

1 passport-sized photo to accompany the application.

• When a National Identity Number is issued, the child will have to come back to the embassy to take biometrics for the passport.

Proof of legal residency (for Norwegian citizens):

- Valid Kenyan passport/visa/residence permit
- Valid Somali passport/visa/residence permit
- □ If the parents are not registered as married in Norway (j.f. folkeregisteret) then you must bring documentation on the mother's civil status at the time the child was born.
 - \circ This documentation must be legalised by the competent authority.
 - Original documents must be submitted to the embassy to carry out the necessary inspections. They will be returned once the application is completed.
 - If you do not wish for original documents to be sent to Skatteetaten then you must bring certified true copies of the documents.
