

## Checklist for application for Norwegian National Identity Number

### The Royal Norwegian Embassy in Nairobi

All documentation requirements **must** be finalised before the appointment. Your application will **not** be processed if the document requirements are **not** met. Please go to our [website](#) for more information.

#### Documentation requirements:

- Go to Skatteetaten's webpage first and go through the checklist: [Norwegian national identity number to get a passport - The Norwegian Tax Administration \(skatteetaten.no\)](#)**
- Original and valid passport (must include photo, date of birth and signature) of the parent(s) attending the appointment.**
  - If the passport is not Norwegian, a certified true copy must also be brought to the appointment.
  - Ensure that the passport is signed under "Passport holder's signature".
  - If the passport is with the visa section in connection with an application, you must collect it before the appointment with the consular section.
- Consent given by both parents:**
  - If both parents are listed on the birth certificate, the embassy will need consent from both parents for the application.
  - If one parent cannot attend the appointment, they can register consent once the passport application has been registered. Please see more here: [Samtykke](#)
- Original birth certificate**
  - The birth certificate must be legalised by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs before the appointment.
  - Original documents must be submitted to the embassy to carry out the necessary inspections. They will be returned once the application is completed.
  - If you do not wish for original documents to be sent to Skatteetaten then you must bring certified true copies of the documents.
- If the child is a dual citizen, their other passport should be brought to the appointment.**
- Proof of legal residency (for Norwegian citizens):**
  - Valid Kenyan passport/visa/residence permit
  - Valid Somali passport/visa/residence permit
- If the parents are not registered as married in Norway (j.f. folkeregisteret) then you must bring documentation on the mother's civil status at the time the child was born.**
  - If unmarried, a Certificate of no Impediment to marriage and affidavit must be submitted.
  - If married in a group 2 country, you must bring a legalised marriage certificate.
  - This documentation must be legalised by the competent authority.
  - Original documents must be submitted to the embassy to carry out the necessary inspections. They will be returned once the application is completed.
  - If you do not wish for original documents to be sent to Skatteetaten then you must bring certified true copies of the documents.
