Retention of Norwegian Citizenship Step-by-Step Guide

Applying for Retention of Norwegian citizenship is accomplished by following these steps:

- 1. You start by applying online through the UDI website:
 - a. <u>https://www.udi.no/en/want-to-renew/keeping-your-norwegian-citizenship-retention-of-citizenship/</u>
 - Please note that you must select "<u>New York</u>" as the place you hand in your application, even if this is actually done in San Francisco, Houston, or the embassy in D.C.
 - c. Once the application is submitted, you will get an email from UDI with two PDF documents: The application and the signature letter. Both must be printed out and brought to your appointment.
- 2. Once the above step is complete, you need to make an appointment with a consulate (San Francisco, Houston, New York, or Embassy in D.C.) to submit your paperwork in-person. When you submit your paperwork in-person please remember to bring:
 - a. A copy of your application (including the last page which is your personalized checklist) and the signature form.
 - b. <u>**Copies**</u> and <u>originals</u> of all the documents listed on the checklist; the consulate cannot make copies on your behalf.
 - i. Please note that some checklists ask for passports from the last <u>10 years</u> and all the <u>stamped pages.</u>
 - ii. Make sure you take copies on same <u>sized paper</u> (e.g. letter sized or A4). Paper that is clipped or otherwise not same sized may be rejected.
 - iii. Do not staple any pages together as the documents need to be scanned.
 - iv. We recommend you take good color copies.

Notes:

- You do not need a personal number in order to apply for retention of citizenship.
- You can apply before age 22, as long as you still fulfil the requirements to apply, such as minimum 6 months spent in Norway.
- If your application is approved, you do not have to apply again at a later time.
- The application is free.
