<b>Components 1: Social Cohesion Component:</b>	
Beneficiaries	individuals and communities from majority/minority groups in 32 selected villages/communities in Central Darfur, South Kordofan and Khartoum states. With special focus on youth, women, local, religious, and traditional leaders Duty bearers including local and national government officials will also be targeted. The final beneficiaries of the project will be the minority/majority groups in target locations that will benefit from increased social cohesion and peaceful coexistence between ethnic/social groups.
Impact/Overall Objective	Social Cohesion and Harmonious Co-existence Promoted in Target Communities.
Outcomes	<b>Outcome 1:</b> Inclusive and gender sensitive community structures/platforms are strengthened or established to promote social cohesion. <b>Outcome 2:</b> Intra and Inter groups experience increased social cohesion. <b>Outcome 3:</b> Underrepresented groups are empowered to participate in decision making. <b>Outcome 4:</b> Strengthened capacities of implementing partners as part of broader CSOs.
